On behalf of the Taiwan Government, the Bureau of Foreign Trade of the Ministry of Economic Affairs thanks you for this opportunity to present our opinions regarding the tariff rate quota review (Review No. SM0015) by the Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) of the UK.

We reiterate our position in the Reconsideration (No. TF0006), namely, that the traffic jams in maritime shipments have led to unstable logistics in international trade, and thus, it has been extremely challenging for Taiwanese exporters to correctly predict when they can make the next shipments.

Consequently, the safeguard measures could result in additional uncertainties. To mitigate the risks of shipment arrivals after the quota runs out, we hope that the TRA will consider making the quota management more flexible (for example, administer the TRQ on a yearly basis and provide more quotas to Taiwanese exporters).
