Anti-dumping duties on certain welded tubes and pipes, of iron or non-alloy steel originating in the Republic of Belarus, the People's Republic of China and the Russian Federation.

Note to the file – Meeting Note

A conference call between members of the Trade Remedies Investigation Directorate (TRID) investigation team and representatives from AllBright Law Offices was held on 19 May 2020.

The call was requested by TRID to clarify the use of letters of authority received in relation to their client; the Chinese Chamber of International Commerce (CCOIC).

All parties agreed that the call did not constitute a hearing.

The following topics were discussed:

- As a trade association of Chinese exporters, CCOIC is an interested party in the transition review.
- As an interested party, CCOIC can make submissions and comments on its own behalf in relation to the case. It does not need a letter of authority from exporters in order to contribute to the transition review.
- Interested parties may only grant representation through a letter of authority to one organisation, for clarity of communication.
