NOTICE OF INITIATION

Reconsideration of an original decision in Transition Review No. TD0001 Anti-dumping measures on certain welded tubes and pipes of iron or non-alloy steel originating in the Republic of Belarus, the People's Republic of China, and the Russian Federation

The Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) makes the following Notice under regulation 12(1) of the Trade Remedies (Reconsideration and Appeals) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019 (the "Regulations") to initiate a Reconsideration of an original decision in Transition Review No. TD0001.

The date of initiation of the Reconsideration Review is 24 November 2021.

Description of goods to which the reconsideration relates

Welded tubes and pipes, of iron or non-alloy steel, of circular cross-section and of an external diameter not exceeding 168.3 mm, excluding tubes and pipes of a kind used for oil or gas pipelines, of a kind used in drilling for oil or gas, or with attached fittings for use in civil aircraft. These goods fall under CN codes: ex 7306 30 41, ex 7306 30 49, ex 7306 30 72 and ex 7306 30 77.

Original Decision to be reconsidered

The TRA will reconsider its <u>Recommendation to the Secretary of State</u> made pursuant to regulation 100(1) of the Trade Remedies (Dumping and Subsidisation) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019 (D&S Regulations). A summary of the Recommendation was published by the Secretary of State in her <u>Trade remedies notice 2021/08: anti-dumping</u> duty on welded tubes and pipes from Belarus and China.
