



Comments on the Statement of Essential Facts Document in the UK Transition
Review of the Anti-dumping Duties on High Fatigue Performance Steel
Concrete Reinforcement Bars Originating in the People's Republic of China
(TD0010)

Reference is made to the captioned proceeding as well as the Statement of Essential Facts (SEF) document issued by the UK Trade Remedies Authority (TRA) on 13 July 2022. In the SEF document, the UK TRA proposed that the existing anti-dumping measures on imports of High Fatigue Performance Steel Concrete Reinforcement Bars (HFP Rebar) from China be revoked.

According to the SEF document, interested parties are invited to submit comments to the TRA within 30 calendar days from the publication date of the SEF document.

This document is submitted on behalf of the China Iron and Steel Association (CISA) and its members. CISA is an association of steel producers in China. Its members export HFP rebar to the UK market. CISA has been registered as an interested party, and submitted several comments throughout the proceeding.

CISA welcomes and agrees with the TRA's finding that maintaining the anti-dumping measures on HFP bar from China would not be in the economic interests of the UK. Indeed, as has been found by the TRA, high domestic demand and international supply shortages indicate that maintaining the anti-dumping measures on HFP rebar from China would have a negative impact on the overall UK economy, which would significantly outweigh any possible benefit brought to the UK rebar producer.

CISA would like to reiterate its appreciation to the efforts made by the TRA throughout the 15-month investigation.

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
