UK Steel is the trade association for the United Kingdom’s steel industry – representing all of the country’s steel producers and the vast majority of its downstream processors. The Trade Remedies (Dumping and Subsidisation) (EU Exit) Regulations 2019 define interested parties to include “*a trade or business association of UK producers of the like goods*”. As such UK Steel is registering as an “Interested Party” in this review not a “Contributor” as suggested by the title of this questionnaire.

In its capacity as the trade association of the UK steel sector it represents the interests of the UK producers of the product in question, HFP Rebar. It will be providing a questionnaire response, as an interested party, dealing with sector wide issues including, but not limited to: the continued need for the measures, evidence of the existence of a particular market situation in the exporting country, justification for the continuation of measures based on an analysis of the likelihood of a reoccurrence of dumping if the measures were to be removed, justification for the measures to continue without a recalculation or adjustment to duty levels.
