*Community is the largest and leading trade union representing steelworkers in the UK. We represent workers in major employers including Tata, Liberty, and British Steel. Liberty Steel makes the Heavy plate steel that is considered in this case.*

Please describe your interest in this case:

*Our members jobs depend on the success of the steel industry in the UK. We have previously seen cases where two plate mills in the UK were closed due to a surge in imports, only one of which subsequently re-opened. We are concerned about the impact on our members and their communities from the effects of dumping. Such practices have significant social costs.*
