EEF Limited (UK Steel) were informed that meeting did not constitute a hearing.

During the meeting, EEF Limited (UK Steel) provided information relevant to the transition review and the points discussed will be confirmed through a written submission that will be published to the public file in due course.

The following topics were discussed:

- Interconnectivity of product categories
- Use of imperfect import data which under-report intra-EU trade
- Injury analysis for categories 7 and 28
- Assessment of category 25 as a single category, addressing injury and economic interest test analysis
- Members to make product specific points
